Both countries have developed the candidacy of the art of traditional blouse (IA) with embroidery on the shoulder (Altiţă), which was included by UNESCO in the List of Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity in 2022.

### Visits at Otenia Museum, Etnography and folklor section (Casa Baniei, Craiova)

Primary school children from schools in Craiova visited the Ottenia Museum and learned important things about the traditions of Ottenia, the peculiarities of the folk costume from this area. Small artistic moments were also made related to wearing the traditional blouse of Ottenia.

In collaboration with specialized museographers (Ms. Roxana Deca) a documentation was made on the particularity of the Ottenia shirt with altită:

Raw materials needed to make the shirt:

- Working tools
- The cut of the Otenia shirt
- The way of structuring the decoration—the decorative composition
- Decorative motifs and their manner of plastic treatment
- Embroidery techniques
- Cromatics

They have been highlighted as heritage values

- The communicational value of the shirt today
- The value as an identity messenger -





#### Current folk costumes, information and reinterpretation



An exhibition of folk costumes for children, property of the students' families, was organized at the Dabuleni Secondary School, Dolj County.

The children wore their homemade costumes, which they wear to some events organized in the locality. Several activities were organized related to the importance of preserving local traditions.

Together with their mothers, the children tried to use elements of the folk costume in creating modern clothing items





# At the Alexandru and Aristia Aman County Library (located in Craiova)

An exhibition was organized with traditional clothing items preserved in our homes from generation to generation.

Artistic moments related to the preservation of traditions were also presented.





In collaboration with the "Gheorghe Chitu" Economic College Craiova, coordinating professor Nicoleta Mihai, the symposium "Queen Maria – Queen of the Romanian traditional blouse (ia)" was organized.

(the traditional motifs found on towels, tablecloths, and blouses). Project partners: Olt County School Inspectorate; 'PS Aurelian' High School; 'Adrian Băran' Children's Palace; General Directorate of Social Assistance and Child Protection Slatina; 'Eugen Ionescu' Secondary School; Olt County Museum; Pleşoiu Secondary School; Secondary School No. 3.













 The activity held on December 1st, 'I Was and Still Am Romanian.' Together with the children, we made dolls dressed in traditional costumes and explained what each costume consists of; we also presented a beautiful fashion

parade.

















1. The activity carried out with the group of children from Pleşoiu Secondary School. We cut out patterns for 10 traditional blouses (ii) and worked with the girls on simple traditional embroidery designs from the Oltenia region.

2. Activity carried out at the Pensioners' Club. During this activity, we prepared packages for the 'Charity Carnival,' where we donated 50 handmade items (napkins, bookmarks, miniature traditional costumes) created together with the children as part of the project.


In a world of constant change and globalization, it is essential to return to our roots and remember the Romanian traditions that define our identity.




